Robert Bosch LLC (hereinafter “Bosch” or “We” or “Us”) welcomes you to our internet pages and mobile applications (together also referred to as “Online Offers”). We thank you for your interest in our company and our products.

1. Bosch respects your privacy

The protection of your privacy throughout the course of processing personal data as well as the security of all business data are important concerns to us. We process personal data that was gathered during your visit of our Online Offers confidentially and only in accordance with statutory regulations.

Data protection and information security are included in our corporate policy.

2. Controller

Robert Bosch LLC is the controller responsible for the processing of your data; exceptions are outlined in this data protection notice.

3. Collection, processing and usage of personal data

3.1. Processed categories of data

The following categories of data are processed:

- Communication data (e.g. telephone, e-mail, IP address, device information)
- Identity (e.g. name)

3.2. Principles

Personal data consists of all information related to an identified or identifiable natural person, this includes, e.g. names, addresses, phone numbers, email addresses, job title, contractual master data, which is an expression of a person's identity.

We collect, process and use personal data (including IP addresses) only when there is either a statutory legal basis to do so or if you have given your consent to the processing or use of personal data concerning this matter, e.g. by means of registration.

3.3. Processing purposes and legal basis

We as well as the service providers commissioned by us; process your personal data for the following processing purposes:

3.3.1. Provision of this online offer in the coordination of event attendees, support staff, and event resources

- Legal basis: Performance of a contract between Robert Bosch LLC and its employees / service providers

3.3.2. In reply to user inquiries/emails

- Legal basis: Consent

3.3.3. Marketing/advertising for goods or services and for Bosch at the event

- Legal basis: Consent

3.3.4. Resolving service disruptions as well as for security reasons

- Legal basis: Fulfillment of our legal obligations within the scope of data security and predominantly, legitimate interest in resolving service disruptions as well as in the protection of our offers.

3.3.5. Safeguarding and defending our rights

- Legal basis: Legitimate interest on our part in the assertion and defense of our rights.

3.4. Log files

Each time you use the internet, your browser is transmitting certain information which we store in so-called log files.

We store log files to determine service disruptions and for security reasons (e.g., to investigate attack attempts) indefinitely. Log files which need to be maintained for evidence purposes are excluded from deletion until the respective incident is resolved and may, on a case-by-case basis, be passed on to investigating authorities.

Log files are also used for analysis purposes (without the IP address or without the complete IP address) see module “Advertisements and/or market research (including web analysis, no customer surveys)”.

In log files, the following information is saved:

- IP address (internet protocol address) of the terminal device used to access the Online Offer;
- Internet address of the website from which the Online Offer is accessed (so-called URL of origin or referrer URL);
- Name of the service provider which was used to access the Online Offer;
- Name of the files or information accessed;
- Date and time as well as duration of recalling the data;
- Amount of data transferred;
- Operating system and information on the internet browser used, including add-ons installed (e.g., Flash Player);
- http status code (e.g., “Request successful” or “File requested not found”).Registration

3.5. Children

This Online Offer is not meant for children under 16 years of age.

3.6. Service providers (general)

We involve external service providers with tasks such as sales and marketing services and data hosting. We have chosen those service providers carefully and monitor them on a regular basis, especially regarding their diligent handling of and protection of the data that they store. All service providers are obliged to maintain confidentiality and to comply with the statutory provisions. Service providers may also be other Bosch group companies.

3.7. Duration of storage, retention periods

Principally, we store your data for as long as it is necessary to render our Online Offers and connected services or for as long as we have a legitimate interest in storing the data (e.g. we might still have a legitimate interest in postal mail marketing after fulfillment of our contractual obligations). In all other cases we delete your personal data with the exception of data we are obliged to store for the fulfillment of legal obligations (e.g. due to retention periods under the tax and commercial codes we are obliged to have documents such as contracts and invoices available for a certain period of time).

4. Usage of Cookies

In the context of our online service, cookies and tracking mechanisms may be used.

Cookies are small text files that may be stored on your device when visiting our online service.

Tracking is possible using different technologies. In particular, we process information using pixel technology and/or during log file analysis.

4.1. Categories

We distinguish between cookies that are mandatorily required for the technical functions of the online service and such cookies and tracking mechanisms that are not mandatorily required for the technical function of the online service.

It is generally possible to use the online service without any cookies that serve non-technical purposes.

4.1.1. Technically required cookies

By technically required cookies we mean cookies without those the technical provision of the online service cannot be ensured. These include e.g. cookies that store data to ensure smooth reproduction of video or audio footage.

Such cookies will be deleted when you leave the website.

4.1.2. Cookies that are technically not required

We only use cookies and tracking mechanisms if you have given us your prior consent in each case. With the exception of the cookie that saves the current status of your privacy settings (selection cookie). This cookie is set based on legitimate interest.

We distinguish between two sub-categories with regard to these cookies and tracking mechanisms:

4.1.3. Comfort cookies

These cookies facilitate operation and thus allow you to browse our online service more comfortably; e.g. your language settings may be included in these cookies.

4.1.4. Statistical cookies

General

By using statistical tools we and our partners are able to show you offerings based on your interests, resulting from an analysis of your user behavior:

By using statistical tools, we measure users, new users, sessions, session duration, page views, page views per session, bounce rate, etc.

4.1.4.1. Google Analytics

4.2. Management of cookies

You can manage your cookie settings in the browser and/or our privacy settings.

Note: The settings you have made refer only to the browser used in each case.

4.3. Deactivation of all cookies

If you wish to deactivate all cookies, please deactivate cookies in your browser settings. Please note that this may affect the functionality of the website.

4.4. Management of your settings with regard to cookies not required technically

When visiting our websites, you will be asked in a cookie layer whether you consent to our using of any Comfort cookies, marketing cookies or tracking mechanisms, respectively.

In our privacy settings, you may withdraw the consent with effect for the future or grant your consent at a later point in time.

5. YouTube

This online offer uses the video platform YouTube, which is provided by YouTube, LLC, 901 Cherry Ave. San Bruno, CA 94066, USA (“YouTube”). YouTube is a platform which allows the playback of audio and video files.

If you access a corresponding page of our offer, the embedded YouTube player will establish a connection to YouTube so that the video or audio file can be transmitted and played. In the process, data are also transmitted to YouTube as the responsible body. We are not responsible for the processing of this data by YouTube.

Further information concerning the extent and purpose of the collected data, on the further processing and utilization of your data by YouTube, on your rights and on your selectable data protection options can be found in the privacy policy of YouTube.

6. External links

Our Online Offers may contain links to internet pages of third parties, in particular providers who are not related to us. Upon clicking on the link, we have no influence on the collecting, processing and use of personal data possibly transmitted by clicking on the link to the third party (such as the IP address or the URL of the site on which the link is located) as the conduct of third parties is naturally beyond our control. We do not assume responsibility for the processing of personal data by third parties.

7. Security

Our employees and the companies providing services on our behalf, are obliged to confidentiality and to compliance with the applicable data protection laws.

We take all necessary technical and organizational measures to ensure an appropriate level of security and to protect your data that are administrated by us especially from the risks of unintended or unlawful destruction, manipulation, loss, change or unauthorized disclosure or unauthorized access. Our security measures are, pursuant to technological progress, constantly being improved.

8. User rights

To enforce your rights, please use the details provided in the Contact section. In doing so, please ensure that an unambiguous identification of your person is possible.

Right to information and access

You have the right to obtain confirmation from us about whether or not your personal data is being processed, and, if this is the case, access to your personal data.

Right to correction and deletion

You have the right to obtain the rectification of inaccurate personal data. As far as statutory requirements are fulfilled, you have the right to obtain the completion or deletion of your data.

This does not apply to data which is necessary for billing or accounting purposes or which is subject to a statutory retention period. If access to such data is not required, however, its processing is restricted (see the following).

Restriction of processing

As far as statutory requirements are fulfilled you have the right to demand for restriction of the processing of your data.

Data portability

As far as statutory requirements are fulfilled you may request to receive data that you have provided to us in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format or – if technically feasible – that we transfer those data to a third party.

Objection to direct marketing

Additionally, you may object to the processing of your personal data for direct marketing purposes at any time. Please take into account that due to organizational reasons, there might be an overlap between your objection and the usage of your data within the scope of a campaign which is already running.

Objection to data processing based on the legal basis of “legitimate interest”

In addition, you have the right to object to the processing of your personal data at any time, in so far as this is based on “legitimate interest”. We will then terminate the processing of your data, unless we demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds according to legal requirements which override your rights.

Withdrawal of consent

In case you consented to the processing of your data, you have the right to revoke this consent at any time with effect for the future. The lawfulness of data processing prior to your withdrawal remains unchanged.

9. North American Disclosure

This **North American** supplements the information contained in Bosch.Events Portal Privacy Notice and applies solely to all visitors, users, and others of the Bosch.Events Portal. We adopt this North American Disclosure to comply with the U.S., Canadian, and Mexican federal, state, provincial and territorial Data Protection Requirements and any terms defined in U.S., Canadian, and Mexican privacy frameworks have the same meaning when used in this North American Disclosure.

Bosch will continue to collect the personal information described above. If any additional personal information is collected by Bosch, we will provide any required notice(s), and where applicable obtain any required consent(s), in accordance with applicable laws in the relevant jurisdiction.

9.2. Sources of Personal Information

Bosch collects Personal Information from the following categories of sources:

9.2.1. Directly from you.

For example, when given by you or collected from you through your access to and/or use of the Bosch.Events Portal and/or the Services, in context of registering an account, subscribing to or when you contact customer support or otherwise interact or communicate with Bosch, its agents, representatives, suppliers, vendors or consultants through the Bosch.Events Portal. This information may include, without limitation, your first and last name, phone number, e-mail address, and any other information you choose to provide us.

9.2.2. Indirectly from you.

For example, from observing your use of the Bosch.Events Portal and/or the Services, or services related thereto. The following data may be collected automatically: the website from which you visit Bosch (referrer), pages viewed, files downloaded (downloads), individual links clicked, search words or search phrases (site search), duration of visit, browser used, device data (e.g., unique device identifier, MAC address, IP address, serial number, hardware model, network information and operating system and version), and other relevant details and/or information. If the visit is a result of online advertising such as banners, video ads, search engine advertising, etc., Bosch or its agents, representatives, suppliers, vendors or consultants may record which banner, adware, etc. motivated or assisted with the visit to Bosch.Events Portal.

9.3. Disclosure, Sale and Sharing of Personal Information – Past 12 Months

Bosch may use, store, compile, manipulate, share and disclose your personal information with third parties for the purposes stated above. Your personal information is disclosed with the following:

- Bosch affiliated entities, including Bosch's parent company in Germany, Robert Bosch GmbH, to leverage shared services and improve our Services;
- Bosch service providers, vendors, consultants, suppliers, marketing, partners and other partners and entities performing work on Bosch's behalf, such as hosting vendors, data analytics companies, and delivery companies.
- Relevant authorities in accordance with, and as Bosch deems required, necessary and/or appropriate by, or in connection with, applicable law, regulation, court order or legal process;

By accessing and/or using the Bosch.Events Portal or the Services, you consent to the above uses and disclosure of your personal information in accordance with this notice.

We do not sell or share your personal information collected through the Bosch.Events Portal; therefore, we do not offer the right to opt out of the selling or sharing of your personal information.

9.4. California “Shine the Light” Privacy Rights

California’s “Shine The Light” law permits those Bosch customers who are residents of California to annually request a list of their personal information (if any) that Bosch disclosed to third parties for direct marketing purposes in the preceding calendar year, and the names and addresses of those third parties. At this time, Bosch currently does not share any personal information with third parties for direct marketing purposes.

9.5. How We Respond to Do Not Track Signals

The Bosch.Events Portal does not sell or share your personal information collected to third parties as defined by relevant laws. Therefore, we do not recognize “Do Not Track” (“DNT”) or GPC.

9.6. Your Rights - US

State specific privacy laws within the United States provide data subjects certain rights regarding the personal information that businesses collect and how the collected personal information is used. If you would like to exercise data subject right available to you, find the “Exercise your Rights” section below. Our privacy team will examine your request and respond to you as quickly as possible.

We may still use any aggregated and de-identified Personal Information that does not identify any individual and may also retain and use your Personal Information as necessary to comply with our legal obligations, resolve disputes, and enforce our Agreements. We maintain and use all de-identified information in de-identified form. We do not attempt to reidentify it except to ensure our de-identification processes are in compliance with applicable law.

Dependent on the state of your residence, you may be provided the following rights:

- Right to know or confirm what personal information is collected

- Right to access your personal information

- Right to correct inaccurate personal information

- Right to delete personal information

- Right to know what personal information is sold or shared and to whom.

- Right to opt-out of sale of personal information

- Right to opt-out of or sharing of personal information for cross-context behavioral advertising

- Right to opt-out of processing for the purpose of profiling or targeted advertising

- Right to data portability

Right to limit the use and disclosure of Sensitive Personal Information

Right of no retaliation following opt-out or exercise of other rights

Right to appeal

Right to non-discrimination

9.7. Your Rights – Canadians

Individuals located in Canada have certain rights pursuant to Canadian Privacy Laws. Subject to certain exceptions and limitations, and depending upon the jurisdiction where you reside, such rights may include:

- The right to withdraw your consent to the collection, use or disclosure of your Personal Information.
- The right to be informed of the existence, use, and disclosure of your Personal Information, and to be provided with an account of the use that has been made or is being made of this information as well as the third parties to which it has been disclosed (including a list of organizations to which your information may have disclosed).
- The right to challenge the accuracy and completeness of your Personal Information, and have it amended, updated or rectified as appropriate.
- The right to acquire information about Bosch's policies and practices with respect to Personal Information, including: a description of the type of personal information held by Bosch and a general account of its use; a copy of any brochures or other information that explain our policies, standards, or codes; and information about what Personal Information is shared with or accessible to our affiliates.
- The right to challenge Bosch's compliance with the applicable Canadian Privacy Laws.

9.8. Your Rights – Mexico

To assert your rights, use the data provided in the Contact section when doing so, make sure that an unambiguous identification of you is possible. Such rights include:

1. Right to access and information: You have the right to obtain our confirmation as to whether or not your personal data is being processed and, if so, to access your personal data.
2. Right to rectification and cancellation (deletion): You have the right to obtain the rectification of inaccurate personal data. As long as the legal requirements are met, you have the right to obtain the completion or deletion of your data. This does not apply to data that is necessary for billing or accounting purposes or that is subject to a legal retention period.
3. You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data at any time, as long as it is regarding secondary purposes of processing.
4. Opposition to direct marketing: you can object to the processing of your personal data for direct marketing purposes at any time.

5. Revocation of consent: In case you have given your consent to the processing of your data, you have the right to revoke this consent at any time with effect for the future. The legality of the data processing before its withdrawal remains unchanged.
6. Right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority: You have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority. You can appeal to the supervisory authority responsible for your place of residence or your state of residence or to the supervisory authority:

9.9. How to exercise your rights

To exercise your rights, please submit a verifiable consumer request or access request, as applicable, to us by either:

To assist Bosch in processing your request when exercising your rights, please supply the following information:

- Full name
- Phone number
- Address
- Any information you can provide about your previous contact with Bosch (e.g. contact point/touchpoint with Bosch, screenshots, reference to a specific product/newsletter)

Only you (or based on your state of residence, an authorized agent authorized by you to act on your behalf – see **Section Authorized Agent** below for more information) may make a verifiable consumer request or access request, as applicable related to your Personal Information. You may also make a verifiable consumer request on behalf of your minor child. Your verifiable consumer request or access request, as applicable, must:

- Provide sufficient information that allows us to reasonably verify you are the person about whom we collected Personal Information or an authorized representative.
- Describe your request with sufficient detail that allows us to properly understand, evaluate, and respond to it.

We cannot respond to your request or provide you with Personal Information if we cannot verify your identity or authority to make the request and confirm the Personal Information relates to you. Making a verifiable consumer request or access request does not require you to create an

account with us, but if you already have an account with us, you may be required to make your request through that account.

We will only use Personal Information provided in a verifiable consumer request or access request, as applicable, to verify the requestor's identity or authority to make the request.

Notice to Users in Mexico: for the execution of your ARCO rights or any other right, you may get in contact with us, through the electronic address mail.privacy.policy@us.bosch.com by sending your request in terms of the Law and the Regulation, which must include:

- First and last name of the data subject.
- Address, e-mail address of data subject or another means to communicate the response to your request.
- Copy or digital copy of official identification to prove the identity.
- Legal representation (if applicable).
- Brief description of the personal data for which you seek to exercise your rights and specify what particular rights you wish to exercise.

Or, if you prefer (it is optional), by sending us the format for the exercise of ARCO rights that you will find on the web page www.bosch.com.mx, in the section Data privacy, "formato para ejercer sus derechos ARCO".

The response time will be of 20 (twenty) business days based on the official calendar published in the Official Gazette of the Federation. The response to your request will be sent through the same means by which it was received, that is, via email. If you do not receive a response from us within the indicated period or if it is unsatisfactory, you have a period of 15 business days to go to the INAI and request a rights protection procedure.

9.10. Response timing and format

We endeavor to respond to a verifiable consumer request or access request, as applicable, within forty five (45) days of its receipt, or sooner where required by applicable law (including Canadian Privacy Laws). If we require more time (up 90 days in total), where permitted by applicable law, we will inform you of the reason and extension period in writing.

If you have an account with us, we will deliver our written response to that account. If you do not have an account with us, we will deliver our written response by mail or electronically, at your option.

Any disclosures we provide in response to a verifiable consumer request will only cover the 12-month period preceding the verifiable consumer request's receipt, unless otherwise required by applicable law. The response we provide will also explain the reasons we cannot comply with a request, if applicable.

For data portability requests, where applicable, we will select a format to provide your Personal Information that is readily useable and should allow you to transmit the information from one entity to another entity without hindrance.

We do not charge a fee to process or respond to your verifiable consumer request or access request, as applicable, unless it is excessive, repetitive, or manifestly unfounded. If we determine that the request warrants a fee, we will tell you why we made that decision and provide you with a cost estimate before completing your request.

Notice to Users in Mexico: The response time will be of 20 (twenty) business days based on the official calendar published in the Official Gazette of the Federation. The response to your request will be sent through the same means by which it was received, that is, via email. If you do not receive a response from us within the indicated period or if it is unsatisfactory, you have a period of 15 business days to go to the National Institute of Transparency, Access to Information and Protection of Personal Data and request that you initiate a rights protection procedure.

9.11. Personal Information Sales: Opt-Out and Opt-In Rights

Robert Bosch LLC does not sell or share your personal information collected through the Bosch.Events Porta to third parties as defined by relevant laws. Therefore, we do not offer an opt-out.

9.12. Authorized Agent

When you submit your request through an authorized agent we require that you:

- Provide us a copy of your written permission for the authorized agent to submit the applicable request; and
- Verify your own identity directly with us.

The foregoing does not apply when you have provided your authorized agent with a power of attorney pursuant to California Probate Code sections 4000 to 4465; provided, that we may require a copy of such power of attorney before fulfilling any request.

9.13. Non-Discrimination

We will not discriminate against you for exercising any of your rights. Unless permitted by applicable law, we will not: (a) deny you goods or services; (b) charge you different prices or rates for goods or services, including through granting discounts or other benefits, or imposing penalties; (c) provide you a different level or quality of goods or services; or (d) suggest that you may receive a different price or rate for goods or services or a different level or quality of goods or services.

10. Filing a Complaint

Regulatory authorities that oversee the privacy laws and regulations, including the Office of the Privacy Commissioner of Canada, advise individuals to file an objection or challenge with the relevant company before lodging a formal complaint with a regulatory authority. If you are dissatisfied with Bosch's response to an objection or challenge filed under Article 10.6 above, or you wish to file a complaint with a regulatory authority first, you may do so as follows:

Under PIPEDA: You may file a complaint with the [Office of the Privacy Commissioner of Canada](#). Depending upon the province where you live, you may also (or instead) have the right to file a complaint with the applicable provincial privacy commissioner/regulator.

Under US state laws: You may file a complaint with the applicable state Attorneys General Office or regulatory agency.

Under the Mexican Federal Law on Protection of Personal Data Held By Private Parties: You may file a complaint before the National Institute of Transparency, Access to Information and Protection of Personal Data and request that you initiate a rights protection procedure.

Under the GDPR: You have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority. You can appeal to the supervisory authority which is responsible for your place of residence or your state of residency in the EU.

11.Changes to Notice

Due to the constantly changing nature of Bosch business, Bosch reserves the right to change, update, revise and/or modify this Notice at any time at Bosch's sole discretion, and Bosch will post any new or revised Notice here.
